St Andrew's Psalter Lane Church Junior Church Activity Sheet 31st May 2020 The story of Pentecost



Here is something to pass the time at home as we can't meet in church at the moment – a story and some activities.

Story

After Jesus had gone back into heaven to be with his Father, God, his friends weren't quite sure what they should do next. Jesus had said that he would send the Holy Spirit to be with them, but they didn't know what that would mean.

It was the Feast of Pentecost, the Jewish festival that takes place 50 days after Passover (the Greek word for 50 is PENTACOSTA) and the city of Jerusalem was packed with tourists and pilgrims from all over the Mediterranean world, all speaking different languages and dialects. And Jesus friends and his mother Mary were there too, still worried about what might happen to them. It was early in the morning and they were all sitting praying together upstairs in the house they had borrowed. Suddenly there was a noisy like a rushing mighty wind and it seemed to them all that there were tongues of flame resting on each of their heads. They were filled with an amazing feeling, a fizzy, marvellous energy that filled them with joy and courage and they ran out into the street, all praying and preaching – and, this is the amazing part – everything they said could be understood by everyone, whatever their language. The good news about Jesus went into

everybody's heart. It was a wonderful miracle, and the crowds began to marvel.

Peter spoke to the crowd and told them all about Jesus and the love of God that he had shown to them, and hundreds of people were so moved and excited that they too became followers of Jesus that day and wanted to be baptised.

And from that day on the disciples knew what they must do, and they prayed and preached and looked after the poor and the needy, sharing their possessions and eating and drinking together, just as Jesus had shown them at the Last Supper they had had together.



And that is why this day is often called the Birthday of the Church.
