City Chapel Becomes Energy Hub

Bethel Chapel, which dates back to 1835, is located on Cambridge Street, and, as part of Sheffield City Council's Heart of the City development, the Chapel is being transformed into the Sheffield Energy Hub. A one-stop-shop where people can find help in making the transition to clean energy sources. The Hub, in a building once used by Cole Brothers as their toy and sport department and now owned by Sheffield City Council, is a voluntary collaboration between around 20 organisations and individuals. This has been brought together in a partnership with the Sheffield Community Energy, South Yorkshire Climate Alliance and Sheffield City Council. It will serve as the place where visitors can get information and support including on things like energy efficiency measures, retrofit grants, renewable technologies, community energy and more. The hub will house examples of renewable technologies and retrofit materials, giving even more people and business in Sheffield a chance to cut their energy bills and tackle climate change.

Eco Tip July: Travel

Avoid peak park season- when visiting a national park or similar natural attraction, avoid the most crowded months. Too many visitors at once can <u>overtax local ecosystems</u> — picture heavy-footed hikers at a popular national park vista or a beach full of <u>sunscreen-smothered swimmers</u>. Instead, schedule your trip for an off-peak time of the year.

Threads through the Cross

This summer, Sheffield Cathedral will be transformed into a vibrant tapestry of colour, silk, and sacred storytelling, as it welcomes the stunning exhibition 'Threads Through the Cross' by renowned textile artist Jacqui Parkinson. Opening on **Thursday 7 August**, the exhibition invites visitors on a powerful journey through the final days of Jesus's life – and what came after – told through 18 bold and beautiful stitched panels.

Threads through the Cross is the second in Jacqui's trilogy of large-scale exhibitions exploring the Christian narrative. Following the success of Threads through Creation, which drew thousands to cathedrals across the country (including Sheffield), this next chapter focuses on Holy Week, the crucifixion, resurrection, and Pentecost – stitched not just with technical brilliance, but with deep faith and storytelling flair.

Admission is free, with a suggested donation of £5 for adults and £10 for families. Every donation helps keep the Cathedral open and thriving – a place of hospitality, heritage, worship, and creativity at the heart of Sheffield.
