Zed Pods

Sheffield City Council has worked alongside partners ZED PODS Ltd and Homes England to deliver six self-contained, single person, high-quality homes. They have been built using ZED PODS' award-winning low energy modular construction system, making them net zero. This project also delivers another first for the city – the Council's first dedicated move-on homes. Move-on homes serve as a temporary stepping stone for individuals transitioning from homelessness or temporary accommodation to independent living.

The homes will be managed by the Council, providing access to both an affordable home and individual support for people to ensure tenancies are maintained.

On 5 August 2025 an opening ceremony was hosted at the properties in the Graves Park ward area of the city.
