Good News from Gaza - a message from Anne Hollows

Friends, I'm sure you will share my delight that our dear friend child psychiatrist Dr Bahzad Al-Akbar's has been awarded a fully funded 4 year scholarship to study for a PhD at Manchester University (the only humanitarian scholarship). There are some outstanding issues to resolve, and hopefully for your prayers. First he has to be able to leave Gaza - and Caitlin has managed to get his name on a list for Foreign Office urgent action. Second, his passport was being renewed when the war started and is presently stuck in Ramallah. We are confident that can be resolved. Most crucially, Bahzad himself is deeply anxious about leaving his family if the ceasefire is not implemented. As far as that is concerned your prayers are essential. I hope that sometime next autumn you will be able to meet him and hear, first hand, about the realities of life in Gaza Anni Hollows

A statement on the death of His Holiness Pope Francis

The Methodist Church in Britain receives with deep sadness the news of the death of His Holiness Pope Francis, and gives thanks for his life and Christian witness.

Even to the final days of his long life, by his actions and his words, Pope Francis continued to set forth the gospel of God's love in Christ. He spoke plainly of the hope that is to be found in Jesus Christ, showed profound compassion for those who are poor and marginalised, and gave particular emphasis to God's demand for global justice. Through his papacy, Francis has fostered an openness to Christians sharing together in the Church's life and mission, in ways which have broken new ground for the Catholic Church. In all these ways, for many Methodists Pope Francis's witness to the Christian faith holds a special resonance, and his loss is deeply felt.

Methodists join in these days in prayer and sympathy with our Catholic sisters and brothers, who have lost their Holy Father, recognising the pain that this brings. Methodists will also offer prayers in the days ahead for the Catholic Church, as she navigates this period.

As God receives Pope Francis into God's arms of love, we pray that he may rest in peace and rise in glory.

Supreme Court Ruling on Definition of Woman - Message from the vicar of St Mark's, Broomhill

The news of the recent court ruling has raised many questions and concerns. We recognise the deep tensions that arise when the rights of protected groups appear to be in conflict. No one wins when

the rights of one group are used against another.

We hope that careful and compassionate work will now be done to ensure the rights of women — including trans women — are upheld in public spaces and in the provision of services.

We are particularly concerned for members of our community and beyond who feel less protected today. We are also deeply troubled by the level of hate and hostility seen across social media in response to this ruling. At St Mark's, we remain committed to being a place of welcome, dignity, and safety for all.
